Nicholas D. Lowry: Master of Ceremonies and Actioneer This Evening



Nicholas D. Lowry, Czech-American, President and Principal Auctioneer of Swann Auction Galleries, is tonight's auctioneer and MC. An expert in vintage posters, Lowry is most recognized for his role on the PBS television series Antiques Roadshow, he also conducts numerous charity auctions across America. His documentary, Identita – příběh českého grafického designu, can be seen on October 14th in New York at the opening night of the Architecture and Design Film Festival. His current project is a two-part exhibition of Czech Travel posters which will be on display at the Bohemian National Hall and at Poster House museum in New York in 2026.

Lifetime Achievement Award: Joan Baez

Disturbing the Peace Award: Maksim Znak



Maksim Znak is a Belarusian constitutional lawyer, writer, and one of the most prominent members of the Belarusian opposition. He was arrested in September 2020 and sentenced to 10 years in prison in 2021 on charges widely recognized as politically motivated. In prison, he wrote Zekameron, a remarkable cycle of 100 short stories chronicling daily life behind bars.

Reviewers have described Zekameron as a work in which "banality and brutality vie with the human ability to overcome oppression. The tone is laconic, ironic; **the humor dry.** The stories bear witness to resistance and self-assertion and the genuine warmth and appreciation of fellow prisoners."

BBLA Award for Service to the Czech and Slovak Communities: **Henry Kallan**

Henry Kallan, president and owner of the Library Hotel Collection, is one of New York's most innovative hoteliers and a true example of the American Dream. Arriving as an immigrant, his first job was as a busboy at The Gotham Hotel, where by 28 he became general manager. In 1992 he launched Hotel Wales, one of New York's first boutique hotels, and later developed the award-winning Library Hotel Collection. His properties in New York, Prague, Budapest, and Toronto are celebrated worldwide for their design, guest experience, and Kallan's vision of gracious, innovative hospitality.



Rehearsal for Truth

The Rehearsal for Truth International Theater Festival is a yearly presentation of performances from Central and Eastern Europe, all honoring Havel's legacy: his artistic legacy as well as his political and human rights legacies. This year's theme was Perseverance, and it was our largest ever, including 16 different shows, from Austria, Belarus, Bulgaria, Czechia, Estonia, Hungary, Lithuania, Poland, Romania, Slovakia, Ukraine, and even South Africa (an adaptation of Kafka). When possible, we work with the cultural institutions and consulates of participating countries. We are one of the few American festivals that practices this sort of outreach and cultural diplomacy. We also mix visiting international artists, immigrant artists, and native New York artists together, both on stage and off. Performances are often followed by discussions with artists and diplomats. The festival is curated by Artistic Director Edward Einhorn. More information of the festival and its history is at rehearsalfortruth.org

As part of this ongoing collaboration, **Barbora Krupkova**, actress and member of **Prague's Švandovo Divadlo**, will read from **Zekameron by Maksim Znak**.
For her performance as Barbora in Šikmý kostel (The Leaning Church), she received a wider nomination for the prestigious **Thálie Award in 2022**, one of the Czech Republic's highest

acting honors.

Special Performance by Steve Earle

Steve Earle is one of the most acclaimed singer-songwriters of his generation. A protégé of Townes Van Zandt and Guy Clark, he has become a master storyteller whose songs have been recorded by Johnny Cash, Joan Baez, Emmylou Harris, and many others. His debut album Guitar Town (1986) topped the country charts and is now a landmark of Americana. Earle has earned multiple GRAMMY® Awards, and his anthem Copperhead Road was named an official Tennessee state song in 2023. Also an author, actor, and producer, Earle hosts Hard Core Troubadour Radio. In September 2025, he will be inducted into the Grand Ole Opry.



Sponsor an 'Azulejo' (Tile) of the Peter Sís 'Velvet Bridge'

"Velvet Bridge" is a monumental Portuguese made "azuljejo" tile mural designed by world-renowned Czech-American artist Peter Sís, composed of more than 6,600 hand-painted and glazed ceramic "azulejo" tiles. Conceived by Art for Human Rights Founder and Executive Director Bill Shipsey, who also serves on the Vaclav Havel Center Board, and carried out together with fellow Board Member Petr Šimůnek, the joint project is now nearing completion. The tiles have been paid for and are already sitting on pallets in Prague, awaiting installation on the Prague 1–designated wall in Kampa Park. The 230' long and 12' high mural, designed by Peter Sis in homage to the Charles Bridge, narrates the story of Czechoslovakia's struggles and triumphs from its founding in 1918 to the Velvet Revolution of 1989 led by Václav Havel.

5. Joan Baez Signed Print of Her Painting: Václav Havel

Estimated value: priceless

Joan Baez's portrait of her dear friend Václav Havel captures the mischievous sparkle she always remembered. This signed print (15 x 12 inches on 19 x 16 paper) comes with a story that binds art to history: on one unforgettable night in Prague, Havel slipped past the secret police disguised as Baez's "roadie," carrying her guitar. Midconcert, she introduced him to a packed theater; the crowd erupted, the TV broadcast was cut, and Baez sang "Swing Low" without a microphone. Later, Havel would call that daring moment "the last drop before the revolution." A work of art, memory, and resistance.





3. Havel and Zappa at Prague Castle, 1990 Estimated value: \$3.000

This remarkable pair of photographs, taken by David Dušek, captures a historic meeting on January 22, 1990, at Prague
Castle — less than a month after Václav Havel became president of Czechoslovakia. A longtime admirer of Frank Zappa, Havel welcomed the legendary musician, who had come to Prague hoping to establish business ties but was instead embraced as the "enfant terrible" of American rock and a symbol of artistic freedom. To everyone's surprise, Zappa appeared in a suit. Invited by Michael Kocáb, adviser to the president and singer of the banned band Pražský výběr, this encounter reflects the spirit of change and cultural solidarity. This pair of photographs is offered as a limited edition (1 of only 5 prints), and no further prints will be produced.


